The recent edition like the other three has been compiled and edited by Liaquat Merchant and Professor Sharif al Mujahid.


Unlike most other books on the Quaid, which are either biographies, histories, records, or recollections, the contents of 'The Jinnah Anthology' are uniquely varied. There is something of interest and value for everyone, the scholar as well as the student, the historian and the general reader.

Adding to the value of the book is the fact that some of the material has never been published before, and much, if published, was heretofore inaccessible to the general reader if not because of the specialised nature of the original publication, then the sheer time span or variety of sources. The previous editions have often been referred to as the best reference books on Jinnah in Pakistan.
